Solidarity Sunday: Solidarity Sunday is a faith-based anti-violence initiative (this year on Sunday, 10/6). DignityUSA initiated Solidarity Sunday in 1995 as a way of making our opposition to anti-LGBTQI violence visible. To participate, pray for an end of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and intersex violence, wear a rainbow ribbon, educate as many people as possible about the need to stop violence against all people, especially LGBTQI. We also ask you to please take the Solidarity Pledge: I will work for civil and human rights for all people, including gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, gueer and intersex people. Civil rights are not special rights. I will seek to stop jokes and unkind language about anyone, including gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer and intersex people when spoken in my presence. Words that hurt and bigotry are not funny. I will speak out against any slander, debasement, lies or dehumanization of anyone, including gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer and intersex people including when spoken by political or religious leaders. Violent speech leads to physical violence. I will work to stop physical violence against anyone, including violence against gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer and intersex people. Violence against any person is violence against all people.

Contemplation: Contemplation is the action of looking thoughtfully at something for a long period of time. It involves deep reflective thought. Dignity/Boston is very thankful for your presence and membership in our community. With 2020 approaching in a few months, we ask you to contemplate your relationship with our community. Would this be the right time for you to consider a run for leadership on our Executive Board? Could you utilize your skills in our choir? If you're a good speaker, could you use that talent to lector? Perhaps, you have an interest in our liturgies and could contribute your talents to our Liturgy Committee. We thank you as you contemplate your next steps in Dignity/Boston.
